I was a child when my father passed. He had never been in the house we lived in, but the day he passed, his physical body was in a Veterans Hospital/Home in Florida and I was in New Jersey. He appeared in the way I knew him best and was most used to seeing him as before he got sick - in full uniform (US Air Force). There was a peace on his face. He was no longer trapped inside a prison of a body that required 24/7 care to keep him alive.

What a blessing it is to you that your grandfather loved you that much to come to you even if that

&quot;closeness&quot; wasn't there. A thing to remember is, especially with older generations who pass is that showing affection and/or expressing affection were not always strong suits in life, but it does not dismiss the internal love that they felt for someone.
