I used a program called Virtual Tape recorder. It has the benefit of allowing you to select record quality which most voice recorders don't. And the quality of most recorders just isn't up to par with EVP recording.

But I would really suggest spending the extra few bucks to purchase a cheap stand-alone voice recorder with a high quality record format. You can do so for about \$30 refurbished.

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
