Any number of things can trigger an EMF meter.

Radio waves in the way of cell phones (even when a call is not active) and wi-fi networks are the most common. Of course just about anything with a current going through it can set it off. A lot of modern electronics will trigger them even when turned off because they are never really off.

Short bursts can even be caused by certain things that move. Water flowing through a metal pipe and wind moving a piece of tin come to mind.

Congrats on the new EMF detector! New " Toys" are always fun, no matter what they are.

So, as Wes mentioned, EMF detectors in themselves are not really reliable to determine the presence of spirits. The best use of them is to attempt an interactive session. In other words, find the standard value for an area and then ask a spirit to move in front of the meter or move around it. If the meter registers then you have something to start with.

Once that happens, then try to prove that it is actually interactive and will respond to your queue. Also try not to move your hand or anyone else's body near it when you're doing this. That could invalidate the results.

Many things can trigger EMF detectors such as cell phones, walkie talkies, motors, metal objects being moved rapidly, or even just the presence of a metal object such as a picture frame or spoon can act as an antenna to pick up radio waves.

I look forward to hearing your results. But above all, don't get scared or worried. Spirits are likely around you at various times and you just never know it. In most instances its nothing to worry about. Treat them with respect, and treat the tools of the trade with respect and dignity and not as a game. That tends to go a long way in this field. And don't provoke, people don't like it when they're alive and they like it a whole lot less when they're passed. And pissing a spirit off is probably not the best way to get the ball rolling so to speak.

Thermal detectors are very reliable...once you are sure you can eliminate the possibility of reflected heat and hidden heat sources.

The big problem with them is that it is VERY easy to misinterpret what is on the screen. The &quot:see" in the heat range of the infrared spectrum. Everything with a surface temperature gives off IR in this this range. I doubt if very many of the people you see using them on TV have went through the training course given to your average user in the heating and air conditioning field.

They mostly get used on TV because they produce really cool images that look spooky.

For that matter, EMF detectors are reliable...at detecting EMF in a given range. Since we don't have any way of knowing right now what type of energy or even if ghosts are made of what we would narrowly classify as energy, they are just another tool that if used properly can help lead us in the right direction.
